To Whom It May Concern:

Due to past licensing compliance issues between the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (PGCB) and the employees of some Gaming Service Providers (vendors) being utilized by the Meadows Racetrack and Casino, this correspondence has been prepared to provide clarification on Gaming Service Provider licensing requirements. The Meadows is permitted to spend up to \$100,000.00 in a consecutive 12 month period with any (unlicensed) Gaming Service Provider. The restriction placed on the utilization of unlicensed Gaming Service Providers is that their employees are not permitted to do any type of work on our gaming floor, or in any of our restricted areas. If a Gaming Service Provider has employees who will need to do work on our gaming floor, or in any of our restricted areas, they will have to file a licensing application with the PGCB at either the Registered or Certified level. We are permitted to spend up to \$500,000.00 in a consecutive 12 month period with Registered Gaming Service Providers, and there is no limit on the amount we can spend with Certified Gaming Service Providers.

Registered and Certified Gaming Service Providers are required to have any of their employees who will be working on the gaming floor or in any of our restricted areas apply to the PGCB for individual Gaming Permits or Non-Gaming Registrations. The PGCB will make the determination as to the level of licensing needed, based on the nature of work that the Gaming Service Provider's employees will be performing. Gaming Service Provider's employees who are un-credentialed will be denied access to the gaming floor or restricted areas.

Employees of Registered and Certified Gaming Service Providers are not permitted to gamble at the Meadows Racetrack and Casino while they are working.

It will be the responsibility of the Gaming Service Provider to assume all liabilities associated with any instances of their unlicensed employees being located on our gaming floor, including, but not limited to legal costs sustained by the Meadows Racetrack and Casino to defend an action brought by the PGCB, as well as any fines imposed by the PGCB as the result of such action. Violation of any Gaming Service Provider licensing requirements enumerated within this correspondence by any Gaming Service Provider will be grounds for the immediate termination of any business agreements (verbal or written) between the Meadows Racetrack and Casino and the Gaming Service Provider in question. Any questions regarding anything referenced in this correspondence may be directed to the Meadows Racetrack and Casino's Compliance Department, or to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board Gaming Service Provider Unit.
